

What constitutes child abuse, including sexual abuse?

Sexual Abuse: includes sexual molestation or sexual exploitation of a minor and other behavior by which an adult uses a minor as an object of sexual gratification.

Other Physical Abuse: the infliction or attempted infliction of physical injury or, as a result of inadequate supervision, the allowance of physical injury to a minor.

Neglect: The refusal or willful failure by a caretaker to provide for a minor the proper or necessary medical care, nutrition, or other care necessary for a minor's well-being.

How do we avoid persons who do not have respect for themselves and others?

What are some appropriate types of affection?

- ✓ Pat on the shoulder or back
- ✓ Hand –shakes
- √ "High-fives" and hand slapping
- √ Verbal praise
- ✓ Arms around shoulders

- ✓ Kneeling or bending down for hugs with small children
- ✓ Pat on the head when culturally appropriate
- ✓ Holding hands during prayer

Our bodies are sacred and we have a right to protect them. If you ever feel uncomfortable with the actions of others toward you, tell a trusted adult.

What are some types of inappropriate behavior?

- Inappropriate or lengthy embraces
- Kisses on the mouth
- Touching buttocks, chest or genital areas
- Showing affection in isolated areas such as bedrooms, closets, "staffonly" areas
- Adults sleeping in bed with a minor
- Any form of unwanted touch including tickling or wrestling
- Piggyback rides
- Any type of massage given by an adult to a minor
- Any type of massage given by a minor to an adult
- Compliments that relate to physique or body development

Children of all races and ethnicities experience neglect and physical abuse.

Girls are four times more likely than boys to experience sexual abuse. Sexual abuse usually takes place in secret and is kept secret because the abuser fears discovery. Sexual abuse is often more difficult for a child to acknowledge than physical or emotional abuse, and the sexually abused child may feel more isolated. Children often blame themselves for the abuse; therefore, it is important to reassure the child that he or she is not responsible. The adult, not the child, is responsible for violating boundaries that the child could not maintain alone. (Walking in the Light: A Pastoral Response to Child Sexual Abuse)

How can I protect myself?

- Trust my own feelings
- Know what my values are, what my goals are
- Be assertive
- Leave a situation if I am uncomfortable
- Don't walk alone, especially at night
- Avoid a situation if it appears it may be dangerous

What should I do if I or someone I know has been abused?

- Talk about it with a trusted adult
- Get professional help if you need it
- If a friend says he/she has been abused, don't promise not to tell anyone
